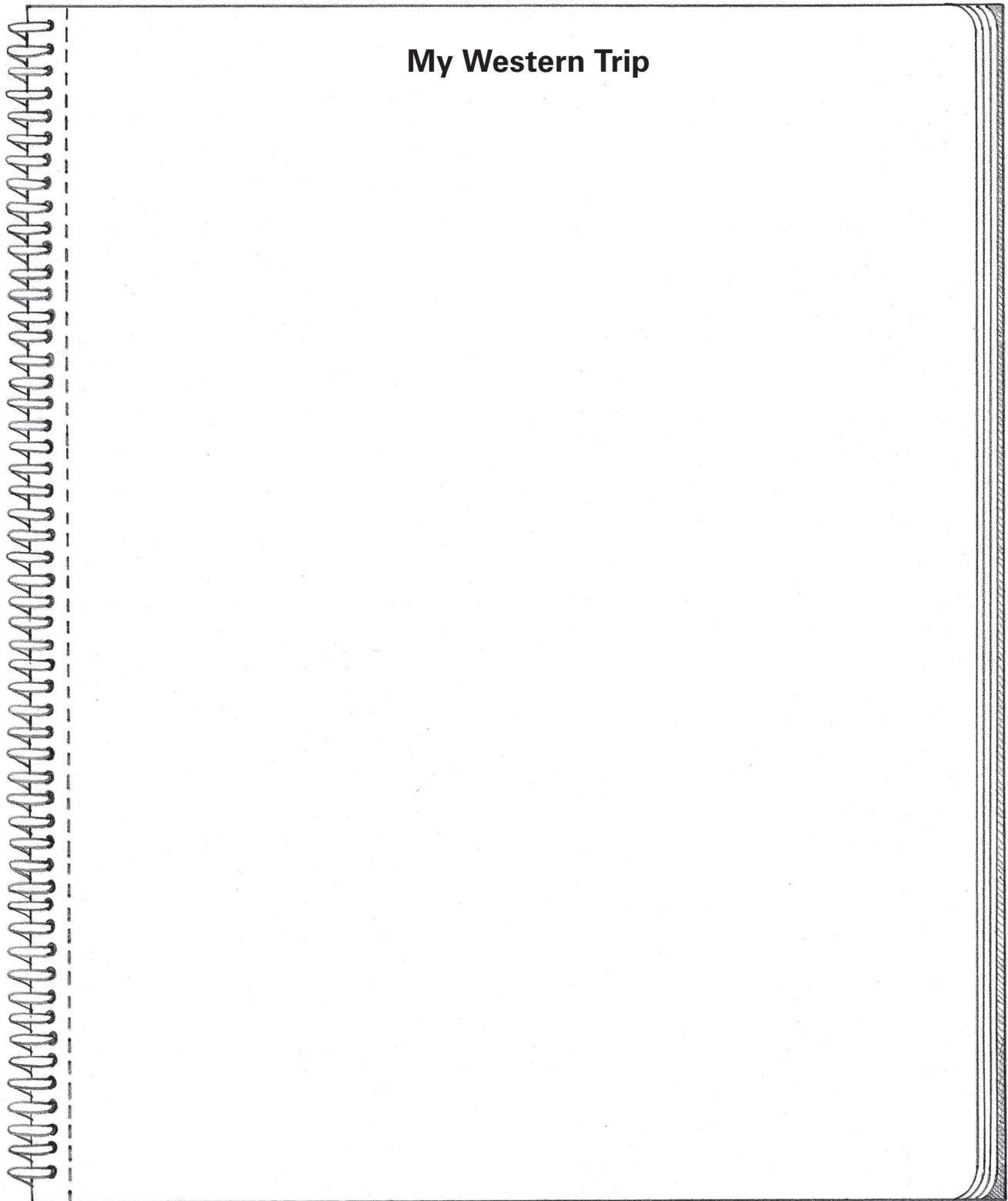


Examine the images of the West in your textbook. If you could take a trip to the West, what one place in this collage would you most want to visit? Why? Write your answer below.

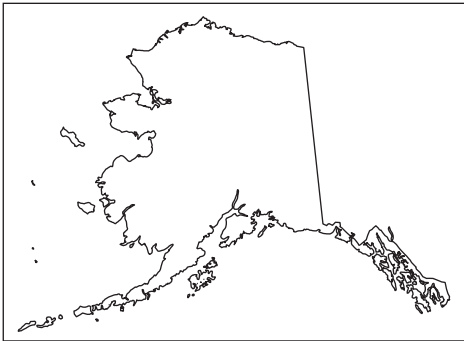

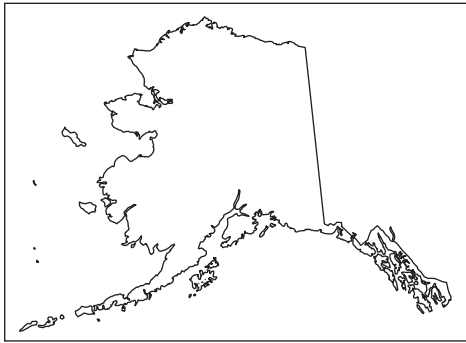
